## Research in Progress

**2020-present – Multilingualism in Early Portuguese America.** This project explores the literary field of the Luso-American world between the 16th and the 18th centuries as a space of contact and exchanges among various groups, interests and agendas, mediated and fueled by the multilingual environment of Early Modern Europe and their colonies. The production of literature and writing in Portuguese Americas was a space populated not only by the Portuguese and the natives, complex multifaceted groups in themselves, but also other newcomers, such as Spanish, French and Dutch settlers who also desired parts of the New World, and soon enough the African slaves, and a myriad of mixed descendants who were to call the Lusophone America their own land. As a piece of the European world, the American colonies were an essential part of the dialogues and disputes of the times, reflecting on and contributing to theological, cultural, and social currents felt in the metropolis. These subjects of the Portuguese crown did not however express themselves only in Portuguese, but various other European languages of prestige - Spanish, Italian, Latin - and the kaleidoscopic variety of native tongues, decanted into a form of General Language, were also currencies for the political, mercantile and communicative economies of the colonies. The book examines the dynamics of Early Modern European theological, political, social, and cultural trades as they also happened in Portuguese America through the multilingual and multicultural literary works of the times.

**2018-present** – Participating researcher: *Conflict Resolution through Classical Literature (AHRC Research Networking)*. As part of the funding stream for Education in Conflict and Protracted Crises, the AHRC Research Networking project “Conflict Resolution through Classical Literature” forms connections between academic research in Classics and War Studies and peacebuilding education in two Latin American target countries: Brazil and Colombia. The project, led by Dr. Martin Dinter (Principal Investigator, King's College London) and Dr. David Whetham (Co-Investigator, King's College London), is characterised by its double aim of research and outreach. In three workshops, participating scholars will produce new research on how Classical literature communicates and showcases conflict resolution skills, and develop ways of employing Classical literature in communicating these skills to conflict-affected youth. In so doing, they will examine ancient models of conflict resolution and map these onto the current political situation in Colombia and Brazil. In addition, they will evaluate how the Classics have historically informed pedagogical initiatives in these countries and devise ways in which ancient literature can continue to enhance peace-related education.
